News from NCCCS

Enterprise is SirsiDynix's discovery tool. Below is a link to the CCLINC OPAC: http://noca.ent.sirsi.net/client/en_US/default. You might want to take a look!

Some of our libraries have taken advantage of this. All it takes is an email to me, requesting a copy of the Enterprise theme questionnaire form. Completed forms are then sent to John Wood at sirsi_help@ncccommunitycolleges.edu, and John gets the library set up. (Note: This is available to CCLINC libraries only)

Enterprise's advantage is that it searches both our library catalog and NCLIVE's resources. Your search results display in two tab folders. The first are the results from the CCLINC catalog; the second tab folder displays the results from NCLIVE. (You want to be sure your web browser settings are preset correctly; otherwise, you get error messages. I've found that it works fine in Google Chrome and Firefox)

MobileCirc is SirsiDynix's mobile application that allows staff to move throughout the library. An overview is available at <http://www.sirsidynix.com/products/mobilecirc>.

For those interested, you can download the app from the Apple store or Play Store for Androids, free of charge. You need to [email me](#) once they download the app and I'll email you the Activation URL and Key, along with attached copies of the MobileCirc Setup Guide and MobileCirc Training Guide.

There is also a free self-paced class available via Mentor 2.0 for MobileCirc. John Wood recommends you go through this self-paced class if you plan to use MobileCirc in your library. He has also set up CCLINC LRC Directors with Mentor 2.0 logins. Contact John Wood if you're a new CCLINC LRC Director so he can get you set up, or if you've forgotten what your login is!

Advantages of MobileCirc: you can do inventory, check materials in/out using a smartphone or tablet (this is great in small libraries where you might be the only staff on duty!). It's like having your library's circulation desk in the palm of your hand! (Note: This is available to CCLINC libraries only)
